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[問題 1] 次の英文は Odds & Ends のコラムに書かれた文章である。 これを読み、その内容を 400 字以上 500 字以内で要約しなさい。また、 ()に入りうる適語を入れなさい。

This month we're taking a look at the mistakes that English learners often make. Of course, mistakes are wrong, but some of them are just not quite right. Something is just a little bit off. Keep reading and I think you'll see what I mean.

Questions that begin with "Do you ever ..." are common ways to ask about frequency, how often someone does something. For example, "Do you ever play golf?" This is different from the question "Do you play golf?" To me, that includes the idea of "Can you play golf?" "Are you able to play golf?" When you put the "ever" in the question, you already know that the person can play and you want to know how often, how many times a week (month, year) the person plays.

One thing that is a mistake is to use "ever" in a "yes" answer. Don't say, "Yes, I ever play golf." You can say "ever" in a "no" answer. "No, I don't ever play golf." It's possible to answer this question with a number, something like, "I play golf once a week." Another way, and I think a better way, to answer it is to use a frequency adverb such as "always, often, sometimes, seldom, hardly ever or never."

Here's why I think a frequency adverb is a better way to answer. We usually use numbers when things are on a schedule or are our habits. For example, "I see a dentist twice a year." I go again in August; I already have the appointment. "My brother-in-law plays tennis once a week." It's his habit. When things are not scheduled it's more common to use an adverb.

The mistake that people make is with a question like, "Do you ever get sick?" Some people might answer, "I catch a cold once a year." It may be true but I think it sounds strange; people don't get sick on schedule. Let's look at a different question, "Do you ever go bowling?" I have one friend who loves bowling. She goes bowling at least twice a week. Sometimes even more. I like bowling but I don't go very often. I think I went two times last year. It would sound strange if I said, "I go twice a year." There's no schedule. I think my answer would be something like, "I hardly ever go."

Do you ever read *Odds & Ends*? I hope your answer is "I read it every ()." See you next week. Bye!
